



Questions and answers about your new 90-day supply network – Saver90

What is the 90-day supply network?

The 90-day supply network is a feature of your Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and Blue Care Network prescription drug plan. You have two ways to get up to a 90-day supply of your long-term prescription drugs (those drugs you take regularly for ongoing conditions). You can conveniently fill those prescriptions through home delivery from the Optum Rx Home Delivery or from any Walgreens pharmacy.

What is the difference between long-term and short-term prescription drugs?

Long-term prescription drugs, also called maintenance medications, are those you take on an ongoing basis to treat high blood pressure or high cholesterol, for example. Short-term prescription drugs include antibiotics and other medications that you take for short periods of time. Under your prescription drug plan, you can fill short-term prescriptions at any participating retail pharmacy in your network.

What happens if I keep filling my long-term prescriptions like I'm doing now?

If you keep filling 30-day supplies of your long-term prescriptions, you'll pay a higher cost or the full cost for your medication depending on your prescription drug plan.

What does *full cost* mean?

Full cost is the actual cost of your medication. For example, the actual cost of the medication might be \$75, but if you have a copayment or coinsurance, your payment might only be \$20. The full cost would be the entire \$75.

What is the advantage of getting up to a 90-day supply versus a 30-day supply?

Fewer trips to the pharmacy: If you get up to a 90-day supply of your maintenance medications, you'll make fewer trips to the pharmacy, and you'll make only one copayment every 90 days.

Pay less for your prescriptions: A 90-day supply of your maintenance medications through Optum Rx Home Delivery, or from a Walgreens pharmacy, costs less than a 30-day supply at another retail pharmacy. For either option, you'll pay the same copayment.

Never miss a dose: You'll be less likely to miss a dose, since you won't have to refill your prescription as often.

How do I get a 90-day supply of my maintenance medication?

Members can log in into their secure online member account and bcbsm.com or on our mobile app. Then click on *My coverage*, select *Prescription*, and then *Order online*.

Blue Cross members can call the Optum Home Delivery pharmacy at **1-855-811-2223**. BCN members can call the Optum Home Delivery pharmacy at **1-844-642-9087**. Members with a hearing impairment can call **TTY 711**. Optum will contact your doctor to get your new 90-day prescription.

Members can transfer their prescriptions to Walgreens in any store, my phone, online or through Walgreen's mobile app.



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Which Walgreens pharmacy can I use to fill prescriptions?

There are more than 9,800 Walgreens pharmacies. To locate one, visit www.optumrx.com and click on Prescriptions, then click on Find a Pharmacy. You'll see search results for all participating Walgreens pharmacies.

I already use home delivery from the Optum Rx Home Delivery to get my maintenance medications. Do I need to change anything?

No. If you're using home delivery services from the Optum Rx Home Delivery for your maintenance medications, you may already be saving money under your prescription drug plan. Congratulations! You don't need to do a thing. However, if you have additional questions, you can call Optum Rx Home Delivery at the number listed on the back of your Blue Cross member ID card.

Do I need to get a new prescription from my doctor for a 90-day supply?

When you choose to get a 90-day supply of your maintenance medication through home delivery from the Optum Rx Home Delivery or Walgreens, they can contact your doctor to get a new prescription at your request.

Can I fill prescriptions for my maintenance medications at a pharmacy outside the network?

If you fill prescriptions for any medications at a retail pharmacy that is outside the network, you will pay more for your prescriptions.

Do I have to fill all my prescriptions at a participating Saver90 pharmacy?

No. The program only affects long-term prescriptions for maintenance medications. The program only affects long-term prescriptions for maintenance medications. If you need to take medications like antibiotics for a short period, you may fill these prescriptions at any network retail pharmacy.
